Russ Green, Great Lakes Regional Coordinator for NOAA's office of National Marine Sanctuaries spoke at the November meeting. Previously he was superintendent at the Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary in Alpena Michigan. Those of you that have been around awhile may remember Russ from before that when he was an underwater archeologist for the Wisconsin Historical Society.

Russ discussed the history of our newly designated Wisconsin Shipwreck Coast National Marine Sanctuary. Public input from local people and industry has been and will be included in the development. The designated area is over 1000 square miles of protected historic underwater resources from south of Port Washington to north of Two Rivers. Including 37 known shipwrecks and 80 potentially yet to be found wrecks. These wrecks are on shore and up to hundreds of feet in depth.

We can look forward to more resources in the area as the sanctuary grows.
