"Ghosts of Milwaukee Coast: Top Ten Ships Still Missing Off Southern Wisconsin"

This month we welcome back Brendon Baillod. Brendon is an award winning maritime historian and author. He has been researching Great Lakes shipwrecks for over 20 years. His research has resulted in hundreds of shipwreck discoveries and he has appeared on the History Channel, Discovery Channel and National Geographic Channel discussing Great Lakes shipwrecks. He is president of the Wisconsin Underwater Archeology Association and is on the Wisconsin Shipwreck Coast National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council. He is active with other maritime boards and organizations.
